The Brunner Awards

Sponsored by Bronx Science alumnus Charles Brunner '56, the Brunner Awards provide financial stipends to students to pursue opportunities that enable students to fulfill their interests, dreams and aspirations. We know that Bronx Science students have a variety of passions but are often unable to pursue them due to cost. The Brunner Awards make this possible.

KEY THINGS TO KNOW

- Approximately 15-20 students are selected annually.
- Applications open in the spring semester
- There are multiple deadlines during the semester



Bronx Science Design Institute

The Bronx Science Design Institute brings together in teams to work together in an intensive, full time summer program where students identify a problem and build a product to solve it.

- Approximately 20 students participate annually

Programming Academy

The Bronx Science Programming Academy provides students with an intensive summer program to accelerate their computer science and coding skills.

Biology Research Institute

The Bronx Science Summer Biology Research Institute provides students with an opportunity to conduct their own in-depth research experiments while also improving their research skills.

There are TWO Research programs – one focused on Animal Behavior and one on Cell and Molecular Biology.

- Approximately 40 students participate annually
- Program runs on a similar schedule to Bronx Science Summer School
- Application will open at the beginning of the second semester



Climate Leadership Institute

Students work alongside school-based mentors to explore the challenges and opportunities of acting on climate change. Students partner with inspirational science and policy leaders in the field, hear from dynamic guest speakers and go on site visits. This program is ideal for students who have a desire to examine the interplay between science and society, and to increase climate literacy and resilience within our communities.
