Parents' Association of The Bronx High School of Science General Meeting, 15 May 2024, 7:00 p.m., Fully Remote

Co-President Jennifer Allen-Cheng called the meeting to order at 7:03.

Jamileh motioned to approve the 17 April 24 PA meeting minutes; Dorie seconded; the minutes were approved by poll.

Zoom recorded around a maximum of 110 participants.

New Business

1) State of the School - Principal Rachel Hoyle and AP Andrew Nasser

Hoyle: The school motto, "inquire, discover, create" informs everything we do. We have many high level, AP and post-AP, classes and are a school of international renown. The focus for '23-'24 was on 1) Social and Emotional Learning, which focused on SEL assessments of 9th graders and saw improvement over the course of the year; 2) a shift to Hess' Cognitive Rigor Matrix that draws from both the older Bloom pyramid and Webb circle; 3) Our teachers push students to think critically; we are now offering discussion protocols to increase equity of voice in the classroom. There has been a shift from "ping-pong" discussions going back and forth between teacher and student to making discussions more student-centered and having every member of a group respond once before someone goes twice, for example; 3) increasing support to our IEP students and families.

Nasser

- We have many spirit events. The school carnival is next week
- NHS students offer tutoring and give tours
- Music and drama offer 2 concerts each year; "Puffs" and SING performances happened; next week is "Mean Girls"

Hoyle

- The Research Program had much success across many competitions, including 2 Regeneron finalists
- The Manne Institute: 70 kids participated last summer; 100 each semester during the school year
- Speech and Debate is #1 in the country
- The Robotics Teams also both did really well; we have a new, smaller robotics division so more younger students can participate

- The Math Team did well
- Many students had national scholarship recognition
- The Science Survey has lots of new articles
- We have 43 PSAL teams

Nasser

- 9th grade advisory continues
- Also 3 advisory session for 10th grade
- The Guidance Department also offered special events
- The college process offers multiple events including Project Accepted, Financial Aid Night, 2 College Nights at which college reps speak; college visits, etc. College acceptance numbers for the class of '24 can be found in Naviance

Hoyle

- Several new classes will be offered next year in English and Math
- Many thanks to the Alumni Foundation for their support
- Summer Institutes this year include new offerings
- Thank you to the PA for support
- The DOE has finally upgraded the Wifi
- **2) Treasurer's Report-** Kai Lu reported that YTD Income is \$276,188. We have a prior year surplus of \$88,467. We are 103% to our target of \$528,552. Expenses are at \$276,188, 52.3% to budget. \$79,635 came in April (gala and other fundraising). Our 4/30 bank balance was \$1,036,844. PA Admin Expenses are at \$34,834 (13% of the budget); Student Expenses: \$122,333 (44%); School Expenses: \$119,0212 (43%).
- **3) Fundraising Report-** Yan Yu reported that we have surpassed our goal of \$300,000, raising \$302,369! Matching donations were most welcome. There is still time to donate and multiple ways to do so: 1) by phone you can text 917-920-2677; 2) on the PA website at bxsciencepa.org; 3) by regular mail (check for your fundraising letter). Don't forget to check if your employer will match your gift.
- **4) SLT Report-** Josh Cahan reported that the SLT is looking for areas of focus for next year. They are looking at gender equity in advanced science courses and how to boost that. They are also looking at SEL survey results and what pieces need work and how parent input can help the school do better.
- 5) PA Executive Board Elections- Nominating Committee member Ellie Rabinovich, along with co-chair Jodi Solomon, thanked the whole committee, the PA co-presidents,

Rebecca Barreras and Willie Lugo for verifying voter eligibility the nominees; moving unverified people on the zoom to go to breakout room managed the process.

Jamileh motioned to vote and Julie Chin-Tom seconded. Members can vote for only 1 candidate. If you vote for more than 1 your vote will be discarded. The poll was open for 2 minutes. The preliminary results were Dimitra Koutsantoni 30% and Deborah Alexander 70%. Katia Kubicek, co-recording secretary, again cast the vote. The Zoom poll still needs to be reviewed. Nominees will be contacted by the Nominating Committee to certify the election. The results of these elections are provisional until the poll can be reviewed. 7) Budget Presentation- Elizabeth Polkovitz shared a series of slides and explanations:

The goal is never to exceed 10% of the budget. The lion's share of the Admin Budget is parent-, alumni- and teacher-facing Hospitality such as Project Accepted, Coffees with the Principal and Teacher Appreciation. Student-facing hospitality is a different line. We take advantage of free platforms and discounts for non-profit organizations whenever possible.

The total academic team budget is more than an order of magnitude larger than what we can budget for thanks to the generosity of the Bronx Science Foundation. There is no academic equivalent to the PSAL infrastructure, so academic teams are expensive. Our academic team money pays league fees, helps with supplies, and provides financial aid for those students who would otherwise not be able to participate at all. Athletic funds go to durable equipment first, practice fees second, transferable uniforms (without your name, multi-wearer garments), tournament entry fees, and then to subsidize travel with remaining funds.

Student hospitality covers food to feed student volunteers, awards celebrations, Camp Science, etc. National Honor Society is dues and graduation regalia for seniors. School Spirit events: Fresh and Fringle, Carnival, Senior Council, Student Organization seasonal

events, contests. Senior Expenses are used to provide financial aid to those who cannot afford dues, the Prom DJ, and to reduce both graduation dues and prom fees for all. Planners will now be given to all 9th graders and upper class students who request them to reduce waste.

Department requests will be increasing \$15,000 from last year to \$55,000 as department requests maxed out this year: Lab supplies, equipment and repair; consumables for Animal Lab and certain lab science classes; books, electronic curricula, musical instrument repair and maintenance. Facilities covers locker repair, material needs for which there is no DOE vendor. The Facility Upgrade grant is 3 years worth of funds for an outdoor student gathering space. Electronic Subscriptions covers Naviance, ALEKS, ALBERT, journalism platforms and software.
